

Dear Friends,

I am delighted to let everyone know that the new parish is now registered with the Charity Commission, our number is 1199630. This means we can now progress opening the new bank account for the parish and begin to look to close the old accounts down over the coming months.

A further important step will be running a giving or stewardship campaign in the autumn. Part of this will be to encourage all those connected to the parish, who are able to, to sign up to the Parish Giving Scheme. This scheme is a means of regularly giving to the church by setting up a Direct Debit for us through the Parish Giving scheme, they will then arrange for any tax refund which is allowable on those gifts to be collected and then the total collection paid into our church accounts monthly.

This a scheme I have experience of in the past and indeed recommended to the Bishop of Blackburn during my interview for the post here with you in Lytham. The scheme helps secure regular income and reduces the amount of administration we will have to do ourselves.

We will be writing and talking about his more during in the coming weeks, but please remember the main message is that we are encouraging one another to respond generously to God for his generosity to us.

Clergy Housing

It has long been recognised that the two Vicarages we have in Lytham are no longer ideal as clergy homes. The lay out of them is not ideal and the costs of running them very expensive, especially with the exaggerated increases in gas and electric we are experiencing at present. The Diocesan Property Department who are responsible for providing clergy housing are therefore beginning the search for alternative houses to become our vicarages in the future.

We will keep you informed of the progress of this move as we learn more.

Two Bishops, not Three

For at least the next year we will be a bishop down. We have never operated a formal area scheme, and from now on both Bishops work equally across the whole Diocese and will be equally available to all who need an episcopal ear or any particular support.

Bishop Philip will be acting Diocesan Bishop. He will continue to oversee the 'growing leaders' aspect of our life and will continue as Sponsoring Bishop for ordinands.

Bishop Jill will continue to oversee the 'being witnesses' strand of work. She will chair the Strategic Programme Board which oversees our SDF projects and will lead on the development of the Strategic Transitional Funding (STF) bid. She will also have oversight of chaplaincy – healthcare and prisons

The Magnificat

This month has a major Marian feast, celebrated on August 15. As has always been the practice in liturgical texts, the day's importance is signalled in *Common Worship* by its being listed in red (the origin of the term 'red-letter day'). It's designated simply as 'The Blessed Virgin Mary', but in the Roman Catholic tradition it's known as the Assumption of the Virgin – a feast celebrated in the eastern tradition also, where it's known as the Dormition. I've written about the feast-day on a previous occasion. So this year I'm going to write on another Marian topic: the *Magnificat* or the song of Mary. It occurs only in Luke's gospel, chapter 1 verses 46-55, and is Mary's response to her cousin Elizabeth's recognition of her as 'the mother of my Lord'. The original text is, of course, in the Greek of Luke's gospel, but the canticle is known in the Western Church by the first word of its Latin translation: *Magnificat anima mea Dominum*, 'My (*mea*) soul (*anima*) magnifies /doth magnify (*magnificat*) the Lord (*Dominum*).

The *Magnificat* has been part of Christian liturgy since earliest times, associated in the Western Church particularly with the main service of evening prayer: Vespers, or Evensong. In the Eastern tradition it is sung at Matins. Western liturgy usually adds the doxology at the end (Glory be to the Father ...etc), although this is not in the gospel text.

The style and structure of the *Magnificat* echoes the poetry and song of the Old Testament, and falls into four main parts: Mary's rejoicing that

she has been privileged to give birth to the Messiah (verses 46-48); her glorification of God's power, holiness and mercy (verses 49-50); her anticipation that, through the Messiah, God will transform the world (verses 51-53); and her exaltation of God for his faithfulness in fulfilling his promise to Abraham (verses 54-55), which alludes to Genesis 12 verses 1-3. Mary's song echoes the song of Hannah (I Samuel 2 verses 1-10), and expresses ideas that are also reminiscent of the words of the prophets.

Through sheer familiarity, reciting the *Magnificat* in the comfort of our churches and cathedrals, as we perhaps also enjoy one of its many beautiful musical settings, the extremely radical nature of Mary's prophetic song may escape us. But it is revolutionary: the proud will be brought low; the humble will be lifted up; the hungry will be fed; and the rich will go without. Did you know that, because of this subversive message, the British Raj forbade the *Magnificat* to be sung in churches in India? But it was not only imperial Britain that took this step. It was similarly banned by the Guatemalan government in the 1980s, and in Argentina the military junta outlawed any public display of Mary's words after the Mothers of the Plaza de Mayo, protesting against the 'disappearance' of their children, displayed posters bearing words from this canticle. One cannot sum it up better than by quoting from a sermon preached by Dietrich Bonhoeffer in 1933:

The song of Mary is the oldest Advent hymn. It is at once the most passionate, the wildest, one might even say the most revolutionary Advent hymn ever sung. This is not the gentle, tender, dreamy Mary whom we sometimes see in paintings.... This song has none of the sweet, nostalgic, or even playful tones of some of our Christmas carols. It is instead a hard, strong, inexorable song about the power of God and the powerlessness of humankind.






