The Vine Community

The Venerable Mark Ireland, Archdeacon of Blackburn recently spoke at a Kirkham Deanery Synod Meeting about the Vine Community, which you can join online.

The Vine Community offers a simple and flexible framework for living out a Christian life. Whatever your situation, there are three questions to help you explore what faith means to you already and how to make the most of it. Not necessarily having to do anything extra, but it is about giving yourself the space to be the person God has made and to grow in your relationship with Him, with an active, practical response to the teachings of Jesus Christ.

An easy way to remember is: Abide, Grow, Bear Fruit which is on their logo. The Vine refers to passages from John 15:4,5 &12 which says, 'Abide in me as I abide in you. I am the vine you are the branches ... this is my commandment, that you love one another'.



Prayer has to be at the centre of being disciples.

There is a pack available at the back of each church which gives you a page on reflection entitled My Commitment to answer the 3 Vine Community questions and review them in one year.

Taken from the Churches Together in Lancashire website - "From the outset Lancashire Sings Christmas has encouraged the people of Lancashire to gather in social places such as pubs and shops, village halls, hospitals and nursing homes, even car parks.

Over the last few years, we have encouraged Lancashire to be mindful of those who are unable to get out to these places because they are at home alone, limited by age, health or simply lack of transport and social support.
