Parochial Church Council (PCC)

St John the Divine, Lytham PCC is a body corporate and operates under the Parochial Church Councils (Powers) Measure 1956 and the Church Representation Rules.

PCC members are appointed as set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church members are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

Day to day management of the Church was exercised by the Priest in Charge and in their absence the Churchwardens and PCC.

PCC Membership

The Annual Parish Meeting of 2004 resolved that the two Churchwardens and the members of the PCC be elected annually by the Annual Parish Meeting and that there be no restriction on the number of members elected.
