#### Dear Friends

One of the sayings you often hear from clergy is 'they didn't teach me that at Theological College'. Normally it is said in connection with day-to-day aspects of managing a church. Two of the topics that raise that kind of response in me are trees, and alarm systems.



Churches and their consecrated grounds usually sit in conservation areas and the trees are often listed and when they require attention it frequently involves getting formal permissions locally and from the diocese. It can be rather time consuming to say the least.

Alarms installations may deter people from breaking in, but in my experience, they are often triggered by faults, the weather or even spiders creeping over the sensors. When I attend to the alarm going off in church, I am conditioned to believe it is a false alarm, though Health and Safety means that I normally attend with a member of my family or one of our dogs, even in the middle of the night.

It has become like the Aesop's Fable, 'The Boy Who Cried Wolf'. The tale concerns a shepherd boy who repeatedly fools villagers into thinking a wolf is attacking his town's flock. When an actual wolf appears and the boy calls for help, the villagers believe that it is just another false alarm, and the sheep are eaten by the wolf.

Reflecting on the story I wonder if the Good News of Jesus has suffered in a similar way. In the past people have been almost forced to go to church and had Christianity imposed on them. The result has been that Jesus has become sidelined and ignored.

As we enter 2024, we need to consider how we can talk of Jesus in fresh ways, not by shouting 'beware' and 'you're damned', but by presenting and living out the love which is the essence of our faith. I am sure that was something all clergy did learn at Theological College.

We also need to make sure that we don't become complacent and deaf to the incredible news of the Son of God either. Let's get out of the habit and make it our hobby. Let's enjoy our faith and our relationship with God daily.

#### A New Years Message from the Rt Revd Philip North



I remember some years ago reading a book to a group of children called "The 'What If' Monster".

The 'What If' Monster whispered into children's ears fears of doom and dread and so infected every situation.

What if I get scared? What if I get lost? What if it all goes wrong?

Now that may have been a children's book, but it seems to me the 'What If' Monster has been quite busy in our world in recent years with stories and fears of dread and doom and perhaps, as 2024 begins, the 'What If' Monster has got himself busy with you?

What if ... these terrible conflicts we are seeing in Gaza and Ukraine, spill over and become global configurations?

What if ... the fragile seeds of economic recovery come to nothing?

What if ... fuel prices rocket again and give us all trouble with our finances?

What if ... the big elections coming up in 2024 in this country and in the United States increase social division?

What if ... there is another pandemic?

What if it all goes wrong? What if ...? What if ...? What if ...?

It is so easy to make ourselves feel anxious and afraid with those fears.

I was struck in contrast, therefore, by a picture which was given to me by a friend early this year.

It says, '...but what if it all goes right?'

Now, if you take off the 'what if' that's actually



quite a powerful statement of the Christian faith, because Christians believe that it WILL all go right.

It will all go right because of the child whose birth we have just been celebrating, Jesus Christ.

Jesus grows up to give his life away upon the cross and, as Jesus dies, He destroys death and sin and evil and all that is at enmity with human flourishing.

And so he rises again to a whole new way of life; a new creation.

In Jesus we know the future. In Jesus we know that we are safe in Him. In Jesus we know that it will all go right.

And it is in that calm, assurance and that confidence in the future can reach its way back to fill our present with joy.

So what would it mean to live 2024 through another set of 'what ifs'?

'What ifs', not of dread and doom but 'what ifs' of joy.

What if ... 2024 was to be a year of peace? We all can do something to achieve that, as we work for peace in our communities and homes and places of work.

What if ... 2024 was to be a year of justice? Again, we can all work for that as we give voice to the poor, as we serve and meet human need.

What if ... 2024 was to be a year of stronger families? We can do something about that too as we give attention to our families and show them just how much we love them and just how much we care.

Our church is committed to safeguarding as an integral part of our ministry and mission, promoting a safer culture and the welfare of every child, young person and adult. We will be promoting our Safeguarding procedure in the magazine over the next few months so that we are all aware as we all have a responsibility.

#### The Baptism of Christ: An Epiphany Narrative

The season of Epiphany begins on 6 January. On this day we commemorate the visitation of the Three Wise Men to the Christ-child. The visit of the Magi is a 'manifestation': it is the first instance of how God is made known to and is recognised by those of a different race from the humble Jewish shepherds, whose 'manifestation' we commemorate on Christmas Day itself. Epiphany, which comes from a Greek word, means 'manifestation'. The marking of the beginning of Epiphany by such a radical story as that of the Magi – different race, different religion, different level of learning and social status from Mary, Joseph and the shepherds – foreshadows the universal spread of Christianity. How this began to happen in practice is told in the Acts of the Apostles, the book that follows the gospels in our bibles.

Epiphany continues for several weeks, right up to the beginning of Lent, which itself starts six weeks before Easter. During that time, readings traditionally focus on other 'manifestations' which reveal the special nature of Jesus. A couple of years ago I wrote about one of these: the episode where Jesus, at the age of twelve, went up to Jerusalem with his parents and amazed the leaders of the Temple by debating with them about the teachings of Jewish Scripture (our Old Testament) with a wisdom way beyond his years. Another is the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in the river Jordan.

Jesus' baptism is told in a very similar way in Matthew chapter 3, Mark chapter 1 and Luke chapter 3. These three gospels, which are interrelated, are commonly referred to as the synoptic gospels because they present a similar summary of Jesus' life and teaching. The fourth gospel, written quite a bit later, in other circumstances and with different purpose, also presents Jesus' baptism, in John 1 vv. 29-34, but not in quite the same way. Even so, common to them all is the description of the Holy Spirit descending upon Jesus in the form of a dove, and a clear assertion that this person, in one sense a man like all others, is also the Son of God. In John's gospel this is confidently asserted by John the Baptist, but in the synoptic accounts the narrative gives us God's own words:' This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased'. These familiar words are from Matthew. There is very slight variation in Mark and Luke, but no difference at all in what is being asserted.

In its own terms, as an incident in Jesus' life, this is an account of a public 'manifestation', an epiphany narrative. But, taking a longer view, the baptism was also seen as an early 'manifestation' of the doctrine of the Trinity. This complex theology of the unified identity of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, took some centuries to work out. But the baptism narrative was a constant reference point and, in Christian art, was a scene that could allude to this quite difficult and abstract idea in graphic form since the Father, whose vocal presence is recorded in the gospels, was represented by a hand showing beneath the cloud; the Son (Jesus) is of course central to the image; and Holy Spirit is present in the form of the dove.


