Dear Friends

Well January has been a strange month for me with lots going on.

At the beginning of the month I wrote to the Bishop of Blackburn to inform him that I intend to retire in October, my last Sunday being the 4th which will be our Harvest Festival.

As a result Bev and I have begun to talk about how we will decorate and furbish out retirement home and about the need for me to develop new hobbies and interests. That will be quite a change as being a vicar can be all consuming at times. A number of people have said I need to make sure I engage my creative side – I think that will begin in the garden.

Almost connected to this I then received my first State Pension payment a few days later and I will have to get used to a four weekly income which I guess goes back to the weekly pension queue at the Post Office.

Then last week I got a phone call from the Bishop asking me to become Area Dean of Kirkham for the few months until my retirement. The Revd Glen Brook, the Vicar of St Annes Parish Church, has been our Area Dean recently, but he has now moved to a new post outside the diocese.

You may not be aware but I have previously been Area Dean in both the Bootle Deanery and then the Ormskirk Deanery in the Liverpool Diocese, so have history in the role. It seems a ridiculous thing to accept at this time, but I have experience and I hope that I can be of use to the Diocese and the Deanery as Area Dean for the time being.



We are grateful to their Pastor John for speaking so passionately and thoughtfully about how he believes God instructs the churches to work together and compliment each other.

Legacy

We are delighted that we have received a second generous legacy in January. Jay Semley, a long standing member of St Cuthbert's, who especially valued the midweek communion service, has left £50,000 to be spent on the Church Hall and £50,000 to be spent on St Cuthbert's Church.

The Hall is in need of some tender loving care and Jay's generosity will allow us to update and refresh it. The money for the church will also allow us to attend to some re-freshing of the building and hopefully allow us to re-carpet.

Have you considered giving a legacy to our parish, it can make such a difference to the future life and witness of the parish.

Update from the Bellringers – February 2026

If you've glanced at the "bellometers" at the back of St John's or St Cuthbert's recently, you may have noticed something encouraging: the pointer is steadily climbing! It's been a couple of months since our last update, so this seems the perfect time to share how the bell frame fundraising project is progressing.

When we first launched the appeal back in August 2025, our target stood at £91,000, the minimum needed to replace the existing bell frame at St John's. Since then, expert advice has helped us see the bigger picture. Given our coastal location and the impact of salt air, it makes very good sense to invest in a cast iron frame rather than rolled steel. Cast iron is far more resistant to corrosion and will ensure the bells can ring out safely for generations to come. As a result, our revised (and wiser!) target is now £100,000.

The good news is that we are already well on our way. Thanks to an extraordinary amount of generosity, we have raised just over £59,000 so far. Almost £32,000 of this has come from grants awarded by organisations we have approached, with a few more applications still under consideration. The remaining £27,000+ has been raised through individual donations, our JustGiving page, and sponsored events, including the quarter peal at St Cuthbert's last November.

We are hugely grateful to everyone who has supported this project so far – whether through donations, attending events, offering prizes, or simply cheering us on. Every contribution brings us closer to securing the future of our bells and the familiar sound that means so much to our parish life.

Thank you for helping us keep the bells of St John's ringing strong.

"I will give you rest" World Day of Prayer 2026 Nigeria

Our sisters in Nigeria invite us to join them for the World Day of Prayer on Friday 6 March 2026. The service they have prepared reflects on the theme, "I will give you rest."

The World Day of Prayer is an international, women-led, ecumenical movement that shares the hopes, concerns, and prayers of women from around the globe. Each year, women from a different country craft a service, sharing their unique spiritual journey and culture. For 2026, the women of Nigeria have created a service that speaks to our need for peace and solace, drawing on their faith and experiences in a world filled with struggles and anxieties.

The preparation for this day is extensive. The writing country and theme are chosen years in advance, and the service then travels to the international committee in New York for translation and dissemination to national committees in over 120 participating countries. From there it is adapted and shared locally, culminating in gatherings at hundreds of churches every March.

This day is a powerful demonstration of global solidarity. It begins in Samoa and moves across the world in a continuous wave of prayer, finishing 38 hours later in American Samoa. It truly is a worldwide day of prayer!

Bible Study Group

On Tuesday evenings we have been studying, and challenged, by the Book of Joshua over the past few weeks and so far we have studied Joshua Chapters 1–5. Here is a quick resume of those first few chapters.

Joshua 1:9

Have I not commanded you?
Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged,
for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.

Stepping Into God's Promises: A Brief Look at Joshua 1–5

The opening chapters of Joshua tell the story of God leading His people into a brand new beginning. After 40 years in the wilderness, because of their disobedience and lack of trust, Israel stands on the edge of the Promised Land, a promise made to Abraham some 400 years earlier, learning once again that God keeps His word.

Joshua 1 begins with a leadership handover from Moses to Joshua. God encourages Joshua again and again to *"be strong and courageous,"* reminding him that success comes not from strength, but from God's presence.

In **Joshua 2**, we meet Rahab in Jericho—an unlikely woman of faith who protects Israel's spies. Her courage shows that God can use anyone who trusts Him.

Joshua 3 describes the miraculous crossing of the River Jordan. The waters only stop after the priests step into the flood. It's a powerful picture of faith in action: sometimes we must take the first step before



During February the weather is quite likely to be harsh, and this makes it a good time to revisit the habit of reading. Here is an inexpensive activity which can implant knowledge from all areas. 
