Dear Friends

In the past few weeks members of both our congregations have met to reflect on the life and ministry of each church and how they support the wider ministry of the parish of JC Lytham. At each meeting three questions were asked:



- What are the most important functions of a church?
- What three things do you think we should focus on at present?
- What are you going to do about it?

Responses concerning the function of the church included: to share the message of Christ; a place of worship; a place of community and inclusivity where people are welcome and come to belong; where children are encouraged; somewhere that responds to social needs.

Some of the suggestions concerning current focus included a perceived need to build and nurture a stronger sense of community; to highlight areas where we need volunteers to assist our ministry; creating a more welcoming space within the church; progressing plans to improve and adapt our buildings and to further engage with children and their families.

The challenge of what are we each going to do about is was more rhetorical but included organising social events and support to improve the hall.

Although they were individual church meetings there was much overlap, but the message at St Cuthbert's seemed to centre around the desire to strengthen the sense of community, whilst at St John's it was to progress the installation of a kitchen and toilet.

Mothering Sunday

Sunday 15th March is Mothering Sunday when we will once again be gifting daffodils to all the ladies in our congregations. We are looking forward to the 1st Lytham Cubs taking part in the service at St Cuthbert's.

Today Mothering Sunday is a day when children give presents, flowers, and cards to their mothers. But centuries ago it was considered important for people to return to their home or 'mother' church once a year. So each year in the middle of Lent, everyone would visit their 'mother' church - the local church or cathedral where they were baptised.

Inevitably the return to the 'mother' church became an occasion for family reunions when children who were working away returned home. It was quite common in those days for children to leave home for work once they were ten years old.

Most historians think that it was the return to the 'Mother' church which led to the tradition of children, particularly those working as domestic servants, or as apprentices, being given the day off to visit their mother and family.

As they walked along the country lanes, children would pick wild flowers or violets to take to church or give to their mother as a small gift.



"I will give you rest" World Day of Prayer 2026 Nigeria

Our sisters in Nigeria invite us to join them for the World Day of Prayer on Friday 6 March 2026. The service they have prepared reflects on the theme, "I will give you rest."

The World Day of Prayer is an international, women-led, ecumenical movement that shares the hopes, concerns, and prayers of women from around the globe. Each year, women from a different country craft a service, sharing their unique spiritual journey and culture. For 2026, the women of Nigeria have created a service that speaks to our need for peace and solace, drawing on their faith and experiences in a world filled with struggles and anxieties.

The preparation for this day is extensive. The writing country and theme are chosen years in advance, and the service then travels to the international committee in New York for translation and dissemination to national committees in over 120 participating countries. From there it is adapted and shared locally, culminating in gatherings at hundreds of churches every March.

This day is a powerful demonstration of global solidarity. It begins in Samoa and moves across the world in a continuous wave of prayer, finishing 38 hours later in American Samoa. It truly is a worldwide day of prayer!

An Update from the Bellringers – February 2026

Fundraising for the St. John's Church Bell Project continues to gather wonderful momentum, and the past few weeks have been particularly encouraging. On Saturday 31st January, the bellringers hosted a special fundraising concert at St. Cuthbert's Church, performed by the talented Lytham Community Choir. The choir learned a fantastic selection of new songs especially for the occasion and we owe them a huge thank you for their generosity and support. Those who attended will surely agree that it was a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon, filled with music, warmth, and community spirit.

Around 120 people came to church to enjoy the concert, including local rugby legend Sir Bill Beaumont, along with more than 30 members of the choir themselves. Events like this don't happen without teamwork, and we are especially grateful to Debbie and the many volunteers whose hard work ensured everything ran smoothly behind the scenes. Adding to the excitement was our fundraising raffle. Including advance sales, we sold an incredible 5,000 tickets! Although there were only 65 prizes, meaning not everyone could win, there were some truly fantastic rewards on offer. Thanks to the generosity of supporters, the combined total raised from ticket sales and the raffle was just over £2,000.

Since the last update, there has also been more good news on the grants front. We were delighted to receive a very nice letter of encouragement and a further £5,000 from the The Duchy of Lancaster Benevolent Fund. With this addition, and previous awards from other benevolent organisations, the project fund now stands at just over £60,000, meaning we are more than halfway towards our £100,000 target.

Quiz Questions for MARCH and the season of LENT

Lent is the most important period of penitence and prayer in the annual Christian calendar. Originating in the early Church as a preparation for baptism at Easter, it is a time for self-examination, thought-provoking reading and Bible study. The Council of Nicea in 325 CE standardized the observance of Lent, establishing a period of forty days in memory of this length of time spent by Jesus Christ's temptations in the wilderness [Luke 4.2]. The term Lent is derived from the Old English word *lencten* meaning Spring, reflecting this season when the sun rises higher in the sky and shines for longer on the earth.

This year, Lent is well under way by the start of March; the first day of this month is the season's Second Sunday. Its solemnity is

acknowledged in church by the liturgy and by appearances. There are the omissions of *Alleluias* and *The Gloria* and flowers are notable by their absence, the exception being on Lent 4, Mothering Sunday.

Some churches will adopt a Lenten veiling, covering crosses, crucifixes and pictures with purple cloths. In the Middle Ages, it was customary to draw a curtain in front of the altar to conceal it from view. This curtain would finally and dramatically be pulled aside in Holy Week during the reading of the Passion Narrative at the tearing of the temple curtain and the death of Jesus [Luke 23.45].

Lent thus has a rich history that reflects evolving practices of the Christian faith, rooted in early traditions but adapted down the centuries to meet the spiritual inclinations of believers.
